- 6. The Most Outstanding Convener of International Conferences/Promoter of International Relations**


This awards scheme is introduced with a view to motivating the staff and honoring and recognizing the outstanding achievement members, both staff and students of the University community.

- For Award 1, All achievements up to the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award will be considered.
- For Awards 2, 3 and 6, achievements 3 years up to the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award will be considered.
- For Award 4, achievements during the studentship up to of the 31<sup>st</sup> December year of award will be considered.
- For Award 5, achievements 3 years prior to the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award will be considered.

No application forms are available for the above awards and the applicants should submit self prepared applications in keeping with the general guidelines and criteria given in the annex. However, the applicants may feel free to include any additional information relevant to the awards applied for in the application. Relevant supporting documents in support of all claims should be attached where appropriate.

The applications will be evaluated by a panel comprising the Vice-Chancellor (Chairman), Deputy Vice-Chancellor, All Deans, and Librarian and their decision will be final. Marks will be allocated strictly on the basis of documentary evidence submitted. The winners will receive a certificate and a trophy and will also be included in the next issue University newsletter.

Applications or supplementary documents submitted after the closing date will not be entertained.

### The Most Outstanding Scholar

- A minimum of 80 points should be obtained for a teacher to be eligible to apply.
- Applications by the candidates should be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor through normal channels.
- The applicant can submit achievements accumulated up to the **31<sup>st</sup> December** of the year of award.
- Eligible be award winner only once

\* In regard to poems, songs, novels etc. composed and dances, plays, films etc. produced, reviews or appreciations by authoritative persons should be attached in respect of each item. In regard to a creative product or service in science or allied field, a brief description on the creative nature of the item should be submitted along with documentary proof. With regard to specific work of international reputation justification should be made.

\*\* It should be stated whether served as the principal supervisor or as a co-supervisor. The principal supervisor is given full marks while the co-supervisor, 50%. Student should have graduated prior to the dead line of application.

\*\*\* In case of MD /MS students suitable fraction out of the maximum marks will be allocated based on the number of trainers

## 2. **The Most Outstanding Young Researcher**

- A minimum of 35 points should be obtained for a teacher to be eligible to apply.
- Applications by the candidates should be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor through normal channels.
- The applicant can submit points accumulated up to the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award.
- Only those who are less than 40 years on the closing date of the application are eligible to apply
- Eligible be award winner only once

**Criteria are similar to those of the Most Outstanding Scholar Award.**

### 3. The Most Outstanding Staff Inventor/Innovator

- A minimum of 6 points are required to be eligible to apply.
- Include achievements within 3 years prior to the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award.
- once the person is received the title, He /She has to earn fresh marks if to apply for the same award in a subsequent occasion
- Applications by the candidates should be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor through normal channels.

\*A brief description should be given on the number of machines/implements/ instruments assembled/produced are sold, quantity of product produced and marketed, software developed and sold, type of biological or chemical process invented, and the impact on any particular sector, industry or community and contribution to regional/ national development.

#### 4. The Most Outstanding Student Inventor/Innovator

- The point scheme is the same as for the staff.
- The minimum requirement to be eligible to apply is to have evidence of inventions.
- Achievements any time during the studentship up to 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award are acceptable.
- An applicant is entitled to submit an application yearly.
- Students who have completed the degree during the year of award are also eligible to apply. Their achievements should be dated prior to completion of degree.
- Applications by the candidates should be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor through normal channels.
- Any special achievement under this category with proven evidence will be awarded up to 05 points

#### 5. The Highest Recipient of Grants

- A minimum of 10 points are required to be eligible to apply.
- Include all the grants received within 3 years prior to the 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of award.
- once the person is received the title, He /She has to earn fresh marks if to apply for the same award in a subsequent occasion
- Applications by the candidates should be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor through normal channels.
